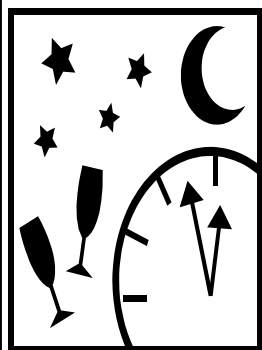

Todd McGrath has logged more than 365 days at sea leading pelagic trips in both the Atlantic and the Pacific oceans. He is co-author of the 2005 monograph, *Pelagic Birding in the Southern California Bight*, and of the 2010 scientific paper, *The Occurrence and Identification of Leach's Storm-Petrels off Southern California*. While those titles might sound a bit intimidating to the novice pelagic birder, Todd has a knack for speaking in everyday language and making people feel comfortable identifying potential new life species while on their first pelagic trip. In addition to seabirds, Todd is extremely knowledgeable about identification, status and distribution of marine mammals. He is the Senior Leader for all Audubon pelagic trips from Los Angeles, Ventura and Santa Barbara, and is a Senior Leader on many Buena Vista Audubon pelagic trips. He also leads trips into the Gulf Stream for Brian Pattenon from Cape Hatteras, North Carolina, and Debi Shearwater out of Monterey, Half Moon Bay and Bodega Bay.

Conservation Matters

BVAS Conservation Co-Chair, Joan Herskowitz, has been busy commenting on several important environmental issues for BVAS in recent weeks.

Marine Life Protection Act. In December, the California Fish and Game Commission approved an expanded marine reserve system off the San Diego coastline, including newly-protected waters offshore from the San Elijo Lagoon and Cardiff Beach in Encinitas. BVAS had submitted comments urging adoption of the plan. We believe this is a balanced plan that will provide real benefits to our ocean and coast, as well as to the people who depend on healthy ecosystems for jobs, food and recreation. At the same time, it will keep potential short-term impacts on fishing to a minimum. The Marine Life Protection Act is seen as a rare opportunity to create a legacy of thriving oceans for our kids and grandkids.

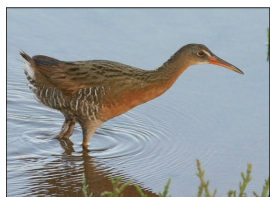


I-5 Freeway Expansion Project. BVAS prepared and submitted an extensive comment letter to Caltrans in November on the draft EIR for this project. Most of the alternatives under consideration would have significant negative impacts on the environment, including increased greenhouse gas emissions. A number of quality-of-life issues would also be impacted, all without achieving meaningful long term transportation benefits. Our letter details the inadequacy of the DEIR and concludes that the plan should be revised to include transportation alternatives that will benefit, not degrade, our region.

Melrose Avenue Extension Project. Our comment letter to the Oceanside Traffic Committee raised a series of issues with respect to this proposed street extension and concluded there is no need for a six-lane road extension under existing traffic levels and it is not clear if, or when, an extension of this artery will ever be needed.

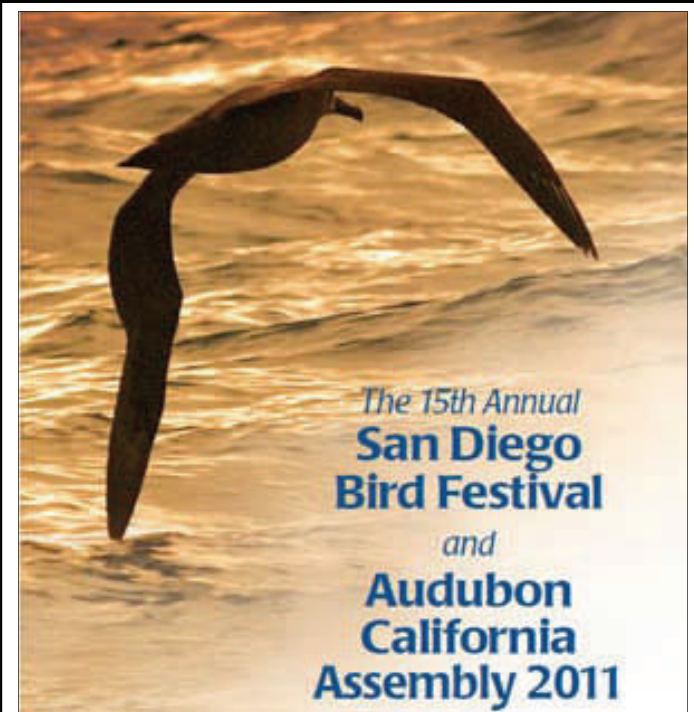
Clapper Rail Returns from Ventura

A year-old female clapper rail, originally hatched in a captive breeding program at the Chula Vista Nature Center in 2009 and released at a coastal wetlands site near Ventura, made a surprise return visit to Chula Vista this fall. The rail made the 160-mile trip along the densely populated Southern California coastline, safely navigating freeways, airports, industrial zones, and several million human inhabitants. Clapper rails are not considered strong flyers and were not believed to migrate long distances from their territories. Biologists now plan to allow the rail to mate with a captive male she's bonded with since her return, and remain at the Nature Center.



Audubon Portfolio Sells for Millions

A prized edition of Audubon's "Birds of America" recently fetched a winning bid of more than \$10 million at Sotheby's auction house, making it the world's most expensive published book. The rare complete edition of 435 hand-colored illustrations of birds drawn to scale is considered one of the best preserved editions of Audubon's 19th-century masterpiece. Because each individual illustration is so valuable, most of the original volumes were broken up over the years and sold as separate works of art.

*Featured Bird Walk***Batiquitos Lagoon**

with Steve Brad

Sunday—January 9—8 a.m.

The varied habitats at Batiquitos Lagoon and several adjacent sites provide excellent winter birding opportunities. We'll begin at the Batiquitos Nature Center where a nice assortment of ducks and shorebirds can be expected. A short jaunt over to the Aviara Resort should yield close-up looks at more ducks and chances for a variety of warblers, sparrows, raptors, and other birds in the nearby trees and grassy fields. We'll end our morning with a stop at a newly-acquired site at the northeast edge of the reserve. The 50-foot ridge-top of this chaparral-covered hillside provides a nice overview of the lagoon. We'll scope through the many water fowl that frequent this end of the lagoon, and pick up a number of chaparral species along the trail to the viewpoint.

Directions: From I-5 in Carlsbad, take Poinsettia Ln. east. Turn right on Batiquitos Dr., then right on Gabbiano Ln. Park at the cul-de-sac. We'll meet a short distance down the trail at the Nature Center. Leader: Steve Brad, 760-633-1639; stevebrad1@earthlink.net.

story, sing some songs, and make a special craft to take home. Hope to see you then to welcome in our New Year and learn more about "hibernation".

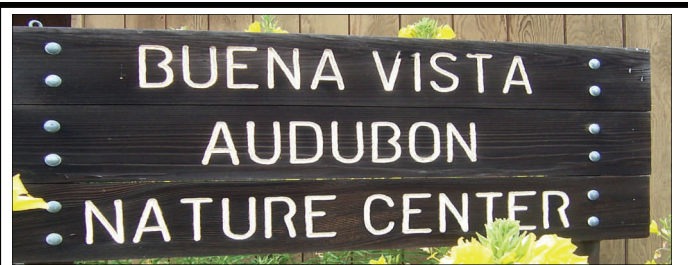

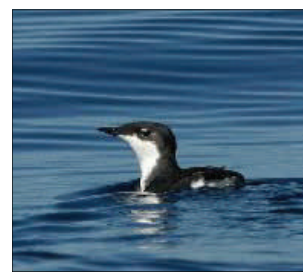
